Ralph & Francene Conrad and Bill & Irene Forshey toured the newly expanded Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank (ACRFB) in January with Mike & Linda Moore, and Gib Radanof. All are members of the Coalition of Concerned Christians (CCC) commonly known as the "Soup Kitchen."

Mike, St. Augustine church, is the president of the CCC. Ralph is the Treasurer of the CCC and Team Captain of the Prince of Peace church meal team. Gib is the Team Captain of the St. Andrews Episcopal church meal team.

The food bank provides food at little or no cost to 501c3 organizations. The **Barberton Area Community Ministry** (BACM) and CCC are part of the "Network Partners" at the food bank.



The CCC is made up of 10 local churches which provide teams to prepare meals in rotation. Food is prepared and distributed every Tuesday at First Presbyterian church in Barberton. Our council plays a part in this distribution of food by providing most of the staff for the Prince of Peace meal team. DEEPENING OUR FAITH

Deacon Jim - This Month

"Do you not yet understand or comprehend? Are your hearts hardened? Do you have eyes and not see, ears and not hear?" Mark 8:17-18

How would you answer these questions that Jesus posed to His disciples if He had posed them to you? It takes humility to admit that you do not yet understand or comprehend, that your heart is in fact hardened, and that you fail to see and hear all that God has revealed. Of course, there are various levels to these struggles, so hopefully you do not struggle with them to a grave degree. But if you can humbly confess that you do struggle with these to a certain extent, then that humility and honesty will gain you much grace.

Seeds of doubt and confusion are all around us. It seems these days that almost everything the secular world promotes is in some way contrary to the Kingdom of God. And yet, just like the disciples' inability to see the evil leaven of the Pharisees and Herod, we also frequently fail to see the evil leaven within our society. Instead, we allow the many errors to confuse us and lead us down the path of secularism.

One thing this should teach us is that just because someone has some form of authority or power within society does not mean that they are a truthful and holy leader. And though it's never our place to judge the heart of another, we absolutely must have "ears to hear" and "eyes to see" the many errors that are held up within our world as good. We must constantly seek to "understand and comprehend" the laws of God and use them as a guide against the lies within the world. One important way to make sure we do this well is to make sure that our hearts never become hardened to the truth.

Reflect, today, upon these questions of our Lord and examine them especially within the broader context of society as a whole. Consider the false "leaven" taught by our world and by so many in positions of authority. Reject these errors and recommit yourself to the full embrace of the holy mysteries of Heaven so that those truths and those truths alone become your daily guide.

As we begin our Lenten Season of penance, let us open our eyes and ears to the Truth that God has given us. Let us take a close look at our lives and see where improvement is lacking. Let us make this our best Lent yet by opening our hearts and minds to God through prayer and fasting.

Father Thomas Blau



Father Thomas Blau, OP, is an "itinerant preacher" in the Diocese of Columbus, having led over one hundred parish missions in Ohio alone. He got his undergraduate degree from the University of Akron. He lived in Honduras and Guatemala on an extended service mission, which piqued his interest in a religious vocation.

Father attended Franciscan University and received a Master's Degree in Theology. He was ordained in 1999. Since then, he has been assigned to Dominican outreaches at the University of Virginia and Providence College. He was assigned to St. Patrick Church as a parish vicar in 2010.

Currently Fr. Thomas is one of the Pontifical Missionaries of Mercy of the Catholic Church, an inducted "Magistral Chaplain" for the Knights of Malta, and the local chaplain for the Columbus Legatus organization.

Joe Heschmeyer

Joe Heschmeyer is a staff apologist for Catholic Answers. A popular author, speaker, blogger, and podcaster, he joined the apostolate in 2021.

He discerned the priesthood from 2012-17 for the Archdiocese of Kansas City. He earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy from Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis and a sacred theology degree from Rome's Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas.

A regular contributor to Catholic Answers Live, Catholic Answers Focus, and Catholic Answers Magazine, Joe has blogged at his own "Shameless Popery" website and co-hosted a weekly show called "The Catholic Podcast."

Formerly a practicing attorney in Washington, D.C., Joe received his Juris Doctor degree from Georgetown University in 2010 after earning a bachelor's degree in history from Topeka's Washburn University.
